Identity which the term



In his plans to enhance the University's System, the OIC tasked the University's programmers to create and develop a system that would be accessible across the University and all its campuses. This centralized system will ensure ease of access for various forms of operation, including admission, inventory, and other administrative management designs.

Moreover, the OIC President expressed his support for the Improvement and Infrastructure needed by the University to enhance the Campuses & offices' services. Also, his platform to plant five thousand trees was disseminated to the CEOs to follow the commitment of the University to achieving the goal of a greener environment and a healthier ecosystem.

faculty and students, exchange of scholarly materials and information, and collaboration in conferences, colloquia, and fora.

During the virtual signing, Dr. Alexander MacDonald, President and CEO of Holland College, and CSU President Dr. Urdujah G. Alvarado confidently expressed their commitment to the successful implementation of the MOU.

Arthur G. Ibañez, OIC of the Office of the President, Vice Presidents, CEOs and other University Officials met with United States Agency for International Development (USAID) representatives, Mr. Todd Johnson and Ms. Jo Ann Dulce from the Environment Office of the USAID-Philippines, in a meeting held today, February 13, 2024 at Cagayan State University, Andrews Campus Conference Hall.

In his opening message, Dr. Ibañez expressed gratitude

to USAID for the opportunity to meet with them and discuss projects for potential collaborations. He also included that he is hopeful that the meeting will lead to another relationship between CSU and

Mr. Todd Johnson, USAID Natural Resource Management Specialist, briefly explained the coverage of their division, stating that they cover issues in natural resources and management in Asia-Pacific, specifically, climate change. "Nandito na ang climate change, nararanasan na,"he

added. Thus, USAID is looking for an intersection of energy strategy, and water strategy.

Ms. Jo Anne Dulce, USAID Project Management Specialist, presented initiatives in other parts of the country such as Safe Water Project in Palawan, Negros Occidental and Saranggani. In her presentation, their projects have successfully managed to give 1.22 Million Filipinos access to clean drinking water, access adequate sanitation services and more than 5.6 Billion in peso mobilized for improved water

sanitation and hygiene. Moreover, they expounded that their roles includes technical assistance to projects and help find agencies that will support these projects.

As the meeting concluded, Dr. Ibañez seeks for avenues in the University that is in line with the goals and mission of USAID, and informed the representatives that CSU will submit proposals as soon as possible after gathering available projects that are relative and suitable for USAID's campaign.

DOST-PCAARRD EXEC. DIR. REYNALDO EBORA VISITS CSU APARRI FUNDED RESEARCH PROJECT IN BUGUEY

xecutive Director Reynaldo Ebora of the Department of Science and Technology-Philippines Council Aquaculture, Agriculture, Natural Resources Research Development (DOST PCAARRD and his team, paid a visit to the research site of the mangrove Crab hatcherynursery system project earlier today, January 24, 2024 at buguey Cagayan.

Exec Dir. Ebora engaged in productive discussions with LGU Buguey Mayor. Licerio M. Antiporda III; Campus Executive Officer, Engr. Audy

R. Quebral; Dean Quirino C. Pascua, the project leader; study members, and Prof. Josie Bas-Ong, the University Director for Extension.

DOST-PCAARRD has allocated a funding assistance of P9.5 million to CSU Aparri. The funding is specifically designated for the technology transfer project titled "Adoption of Improved Hatchery-Nursery Culture System for Commercial Production of Mangrove Crab Seedstock in Buguey, Cagayan", which is the first Nursery Facility in Region 2. Dr. Quirino Pascua, the esteemed Dean of the College

of Fisheries at CSU leads the said project.

The visit ensures the smooth monitoring of the mangrove crab hatchery-nursery system, which promisingly ensures a reliable and sustainable supply of mangrove crab seedstocks in the municipality of Buguey, Cagayan reducing dependence on wild seedstocks and further contributing to the long-term growth and development of the mangrove crab industry in the region

Meanwhile, asked on the current status of the project, Dr. Pascua stated that the crab hatchery is still on-going. The edifice will house the breeding area for the mangrove crab. Detailing the edifice, Dr Pascua stated that the breeding area includes 5 units 1m high by .8m in diameter hatching tanks where the male and female mangrove breeders will mate and breed, and 8 units of 1m high by 3m in diameters larval rearing tanks where the newly hatched larvae of will be nursed for a period of 30-60 days until the larvae will metamorphose into a crab-instar 2 which are ready to be marketed for growout purposes.





fter the approval of a five million institutional funding for a Coffee Hub Program proposed by Prof. Ana Marie C. Cauilan, Cagayan State University (CSU) at Lallo is now in full gear to boost its niche program on coffee- a stepping stone on its bid to be a coffee authority in the province.

Members of the CSU Coffee Research, Development and Extension (RDE) Hub Program, and officials of the University RDE and University Infrastructure Office converged at CSU Lal-lo on February 8 to work on the documentary requirements for the program's immediate implementation this first quarter of 2024.

Spearheaded by the Coffee Hub Program Leader Prof. Cauilan, the team finalized the proposals, prepared the purchase requests, and charted the work, activities and financial plans under the guidance of CSU RDE officials led by Dr. Junel B. Guzman, Vice President for RDE.

Program's Deliverables

According to Prof. Cauilan, the program envisions to make CSU Lal-lo the coffee authority in Cagayan making it a Center for Coffee Research and Innovation.

She said the program components include research, coffee production, coffee farm tourism, coffee processing and commercialization.

"We passed through a rigorous process of having the program budgeted by the university- no shortcuts. We defended before the President, the Execom-Mancom members. We submitted our program for in-house technical working group evaluation, and today [February 8] we brought the entire RDE team and infra [infrastructure office] to Lallo to guide us in a finalization writeshop," she said.

Prof. Cauilan also added that the program is a passion program of Former President Dr. Urdujah G. Alvarado, an alumna of CSU Lallo formerly CVAC, who has never faltered in providing funds for CSU Lallo to catapult its coffee niche.

"OIC Dr. Arthur G. Ibañez is also very supportive to this program. Being an expert in structural engineering, he is personally and directly involved in the design and structure of a future coffee shop in the campus, a view deck as well as the refurbishment of the coffee processing center," she said.

Continued Efforts

Through the collaboration of the faculty and staff, the program is a continuation of the initial effort of the campus in establishing a demonstration farm and nursery of coffee that started in 2021.

Through grant from CSU and DOST in 2021, the campus started producing, processing and marketing of the Valena Heritage Coffee which is currently in the market.

With the program's funding, Prof. Cauilan hopes CSU Lallo to produce more coffee blends through a development study as a component of the program.

It is noted that CSU Lal-lo cultivates almost 6,000 mature coffee-bearing trees in the Valena site where three species of coffee- Excelsa, Robusta, and Liberica, thrive.

Established Partners Prof.

Cauilan also shared that initial conversations done with the LGU Lal-lo assure that the campus will also become the supplier of coffee beans and blends of the Coffee Shop currently under construction at the LGU grounds.

"We are assured by the LGU Lal-lo that all coffee supplies for their coffee shop will come from our produce in the campus. We are thankful that we gain a strong support of the LGU for our program," she shared.

It was reported that on February 1, the CSU Execom and Mancom team led by Dr. Alvarado herself met with Lal-lo Mayor, Hon. Florante C. Pascual, Vice Mayor, Hon. Maria Olivia C. Pascual, and other LGU officials to discuss the possible partnership activities CSU and LGU will undertake for the Coffee Hub Program.

With the assured support from stakeholders, CSU hopes for the realization of the deliverables of the program as well as the positive community impact it will cause among nearby communities and the entire province.


The inspiration for this
