
Fr. Aquino questioned the motives behind the pursuit of titles and distinctions within the university, urging faculty members to focus on the wellbeing and growth of their

CSU OFFICIALS ATTEND PHILIPPINES INTENSE EDUCATION EXHIBIT, OIC PRESIDENT IBANEZ SIGNS MOUS

fficials from Cagayan State University recently participated Philippines in the Intense Education Exhibit, an event aimed at bringing educational together institutions, industry leaders, and students. The exhibit featured presentations from various Taiwan universities showcasing their educational programs and scholarship opportunities, with the goal of strengthening the relationship between the Philippines and Taiwan.

The Intense Program, a collaborative effort involving the Taiwan Ministry of Education, the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in the Philippines, and participating Taiwanese universities such as

Kun Shan University, Cheng Shiu University, and Minghsin University of Science and Technology, provided a platform for Philippine universities to engage in Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs) with their Taiwan and Philippine counterparts. Notable attendees at the MOU signing included CHED Commissioner Agnes Valenzuela and Manila Economic Cultural Office BOD Member Charo Munsayac.

With a fund of 160 million US dollars over five years, the Intense Program offers CSU and other Philippine University students the opportunity to study abroad through a full scholarship, monthly allowance and potential job prospects upon graduation. The program focuses on attracting

students aligned with science, technology, engineering, math (STEM), and finance disciplines.

In a separate event, OIC President Ibanez signed MOUs between Deh Hyu College of Nursing and Health and Fo Guang University Taiwan, outlining plans for student and faculty mobilization, joint research activities, publication collaborations, seminar participation, academic meetings, exchange of instructional materials and special short-term academic programs.

Among the CSU officials present at the Intense Program exhibit and MOU signing were VP Mariden Cauilan, VP Junel Guzman, CEO Froilan Pacris, CEO Roger Rumpon,

University Director for Internationalization Kristine Lara, EA to the President and University Information Officer Marie Cauilan, CSU Gonzaga Coordinator for Partnership Charisma Vivit and Ms. Kristine Tumabao, an MS graduate scholar from a Philippine-Taiwan collaboration program.

The MOU signing was the result of an initial meeting between Taiwan Ministry of Education officials Mr. Chris Lou, Mr. Jacky Huang, Mr. Joselito Elvena and CSU Representative CEO Pacris in Baguio City, underscoring the commitment to fostering educational partnerships between Taiwan and CSU.







ACADEMIC AND RESEARCH PARTNERSHIPS WITH TAIWAN UNIVERSITIES

n a groundbreaking development for academic and research collaboration, OIC Arthur Ibańez has sent a delegation of officials from the Cagayan State University to Taiwan to finalize partnerships with various universities in the country. The delegation, led by Vice President for Academic Affairs Mariden Cauilan, included Campus Executive Officers Froilan Pacris, Hitler Dangatan, Rodel Alegado and Policarpio Mabborang, as well as University Information Officer and Executive Assistant

to the President Marie Cauilan.

During their visit, VP Mariden Cauilan represented OIC Ibanez in meetings with officials from Taiwan universities and CSU CEOs, while UIO Marie Cauilan introduced CSU to the universities by presenting the institution's background, niches, programs, strengths and accolades. This faceto-face encounter with universities from the two countries garnered the trust of the Taiwan universities and paved the way for potential

collaborations in the fields of Hospitality Management, Agriculture, Engineering and Business.

The outcome of this visit is expected to prioritize the outbound mobilization of at most 200 students from CSU to Taiwan for academic exchanges and research opportunities. The Taiwan universities have expressed their excitement over the collaboration, with officials stating their eagerness to personally meet OIC President Arthur Ibanez and potentially invite him to Taiwan in the

coming months.

This partnership between CSU and Taiwan universities marks a significant step towards enhancing academic and research opportunities for students and faculty members. It is expected to open doors for knowledge exchange, research collaborations and cultural exchanges between the two countries, ultimately benefiting the academic community as a whole.

The Coffeehub Cafe, set to be attached to the existing coffee processing facility, will not only showcase originally blended coffee under research but also serve as a showroom for coffee-based food products for sale and a training ground for students. Meanwhile, the Hacienda Valena Viewdeck, designed to resemble the iconic

Magapit Bridge in Lallo, will offer visitors a stunning view of the campus's coffee plantation.

The tree planting activity saw the participation of key figures including OIC President Arthur Ibanez, Mayor Florante Pascual, Vice Mayor Olivia Pascual, VP Junel Guzman, CEO Pol Mabborang, CEO Froilan Pacris, Jr and CEO Rodel Alegado and several university officials, coming together to plant coffee trees on the campus. This initiative aims to enhance coffee production at CSU Lallo and promote sustainability in the region.

Furthermore, MOAs were signed between CSU and

LGU Lallo, as well as CSU and adopted school Magapit National High and Barangay Logac, Lallo. These agreements focus on projects such as road improvement in the Valena Coffee Plantation and community empowerment through coffee production. The collaboration also includes the supply of roasted and blended Oliviante Original CSU Blend Coffee Beans for the LGU coffee shop, Cafe Nueva Segovia fostering partnerships between the university, local government and community stakeholders.

These initiatives are part of the 5M RIPE COFFEEHUB

Project of CSU Lallo, aimed at promoting sustainable coffee production and processing on campus. The commitment to the development of niche programs at the university is evident in the collaborative efforts of all parties involved.

The continuous development of CSU Lallo Campus through the RIPE Coffeehub Program signals a promising future for the university and the Lallo municipality, with a strong emphasis on innovation, sustainability and community empowerment.

CSU RENEWS STATUS AS REGISTERED PUBLISHER FOR PRINT AND ONLINE FORMATS

State agayan University (CSU) proudly announces the renewal of its status as a Registered Publisher for both print and online formats. This certification, granted by the National Book Development Board (NBDB) in compliance with the Book Publishing Industry Development Act (Republic Act 8047), reinforces CSU's commitment to strengthening its science communication system and ownership of knowledge produced through its core mandates: Instruction, Research, Extension Production (IREP).

The renewed certification, signed by Charisse Aquino-Tugade, the Executive Director of NBDB, remains valid until April 30, 2025. This recognition underscores the vital role of book publication in the holistic development of the Filipino people and contributes to nation-building and continuous growth on a national scale.

As a registered publisher, CSU is authorized to publish a wide range of materials, including books, textbooks,

cultural scientific journals, and medical publications, architectural and professional magazines, and book catalogs. This status also grants CSU access to the online application International Book for Standard Number (ISBN) and International Serial Standard Number (ISSN) from the National Library of the Philippines. These identifiers are essential for the publication, dissemination and metadata preservation of scholarly information.

CSÚ has been actively involved in publishing academic journals, supplementary learning resources, and various books. These publications include works authored by students, faculty members and outputs from conference initiatives, showcasing the diverse and rich intellectual contributions within the university community. In 2023, CSU recorded print and online publications specifically academic journals, supplementary learning resource, textbook, book and pamphlets generated from RDE projects. Additionally, CSU has been proactive in

orienting faculty members and students about the publication process. Several workshops and orientation sessions have been conducted to guide them through the process of publishing registered books and IEC materials. IC Arthur Ibañez recently convened an expanded Executive and Management committee meeting at the CSU Sanchez Mira Nagbaranganan Site. Acknowledging the efforts of CEO Rodel Alegado in preparing the venue, President Ibañez's directive in March to fast-track the connection of electricity at the Nagbaranganan Site came to fruition just in time for the expanded Execom Mancom Meeting.

While Execom Mancom meetings typically involve Vice Presidents and CEOs exclusively, OIC Ibañez recognized the value of including University Directors and University and College Deans in this meeting. Emphasizing the importance of junior officials in contributing

to administrative problemsolving, he highlighted the significance of exposing them to executive and management committee meetings as a training ground for future higher administrative positions.

With several high-ranking university officials expected to retire in the coming years, OIC Ibañez entrusts the future of the university to junior officials and encouraged their active participation in execom mancom meetings.

During the meeting, OIC Ibañez directed Vice Presidents and CEOs to visit all campuses and extension sites, with a special focus on the Calayan Campus, an island campus that often goes overlooked. He further emphasized the importance of expanding the Expanded Tertiary Education

Equivalency and Accreditation Program (ETEEAP) and urged Deans to submit proposals for the same.

He also tasked the Deans with completing the necessary documentary requirements for the issuance of Certificates of Program Compliance (COPC) for select graduate and undergraduate programs, with all expenses covered by the university. Additionally, he encouraged the Deans to strategize ways to enhance their performance, particularly in board exams.

To bolster the deliverables of campuses and colleges, OIC Ibañez pledged to provide two duplicating machines, 200,000 pesos worth of books for the Piat campus, a university-funded COPC writeshop, and laboratory equipment. He also unveiled

a macro development plan for the CSU SM Nagbaranganan Site, focusing on integrating agriculture and tourism components to establish farm areas for production and student research laboratories.

OIC Ibañez's steadfast commitment to empowering junior officials and outlining priorities for the coming months underscores his dedication to the development and growth of the Cagayan State University. With a strategic vision and emphasis on inclusivity, the university is well-positioned for continued success and progress in the future.

Looking ahead, the OIC announced plans for the next Expanded Execom and Mancom meeting to be hosted at the CSU Aparri Campus.
