agayan State University -Lasam Campus virtually launches the newly improved In-House Cacao Processing Center last December 2, 2020 via Zoom and the University President's Page.

The launch was part of the Regional Science and Technology Week by the Department of Science and Technology Region 2, one of the primary benefactors of the center with a steady streamline of support through technology transfer and the provision of equipment for chocolate making. The CSU Cacao Processing Center at CSU Lasam opens its arms to provide technical assistance through readily available equipment like the Portasol

which is meant for the farmers to dry their cacao beans in an efficient and sanitary way.

Most importantly, the center provides cacao growers a hands-on and actual experience on the practice of food safety, processing, and packaging.

The collaboration with the Department of Science and Technology Region II has catapulted the program to reach greater heights. The Department of Science and Technology Regional Office 2 awarded CSU an amount of 600,000.00 pesos to enhance the existing cacao processing program.

This grant was used to upgrade the existing processing tools of the center to cater to a greater number of farmers and

adaptors.

The Cacao Processing Center will not only help the community but will also be used as a support to instruction. This center will serve as a training ground to showcase the best practices of cacao that can be a learning avenue for students in Industrial Technology and Food Technology.

At the moment, the program's humble beginnings has come into fruition

as it won Third Place during the 30th CVAARRD Regional Symposium on Research, Development and Extension highlighting on the best practices of the project.

All the audit sessions were




RASUC 02 AIMS TO STRENGTHEN ICT INFRASTRUCTURE FOR ONLINE LEARNING SYSTEM

The heavy rains brought by Typhoon Ulysses and the water released from Magat Dam has brought the whole province to experience massive flooding. This resulted in previously unflooded territories to be submerged in water, placing around 90% of the province under water which submerged agricultural crops, buildings, and houses.

As a response to this unprecedented calamity, Cagayan State University took immediate action to be of aid to Cagayano families that were struck by the rising waters. Armed with the different campuses across the province, relief operation response teams were formed to lead in reaching out to farflung areas to provide relief packages.

The initiative was dubbed as The Kaagapay Mo, CSU Relief Operations Team which was led by President Urdujah G. Alvarado and was composed of the different Campus Executive Officers and their group.

A. Pacris, and CEO Narcitas B. Ouano and their teams headed to Amulung West, one of the flood stricken places in Cagayan, and distributed food relief packages to eight barangays that experienced massive flooding during the onslaught of Typhoon Ulysses last November 19, 2020.

The barangays reached out by the food relief included Anabuculan, Alituntung, Logung, Nangalasuan, Cordova, Masikal, Nangalisan, and Pacac Pequeno.







Cagayan State University fulfills its mandate to be of help to the community as it procured and distributed food relief packages has continued towards this effort to tap on the different municipalities in the province to extend help through relief packages.

President Alvarado extends her heartfelt thanks to the generous donors from various parts of the world who gave monetary and in-kind donations. She assured them that their donations are in

good hands and reached the flood stricken communities as soon as possible.

In a continued effort to provide help in all parts of the province that were devastated by the flood brought by Typhoon Ulysses, Cagayan State University Team led by President Urdujah G. Alvarado also visited Barangay Centro Norte, Barangay L. Adviento, Barangay Casicallan Sur in Gatarran, Cagayan to distribute relief packs for flood-affected families. The team was composed of CSU officials, faculty, and staff from CSU Andrews, Gonzaga, Lal-lo, and Sanchez Mira last November 21, 2020.

Aside from these endeavors, other campuses also conducted their own relief operations in other parts of the province and are touching down to various farflung areas to extend a helping hand to as much Cagayano families as possible. A lot of private people and companies and local government units shared donations to make the mobilization possible. In total, Cagayan State University was able to reach 20 municaplities/ cities, covering a total of 125 barangays. NEW PhilSTRA PRESIDENT HAILS FROM CSU CARIG




