With the province of Lal-lo's Rural Improvement Club identifying citronella oil as its main product, CSU sought to expand the cause by delivering scientific studies on citronella through the improvement of extraction processes and extensive research on citronella's benefits.

These projects are all in close partnership with DOST Region II who assisted in the projects through funding and equipment support. University President Urdujah G. Alvarado thanked DOST's Engr. Sancho A. Mabborang and Engr. Sylvia T.

021 is a year of external partnership to Cagayan **⊿**State University-Aparri Campus as it collaborated research with Western Philippines University GeMPHIL: Genetic on Characterization of Macrobrachium Populations in the Philippines for broodstock development and seed production through its newly-recruited member of the College of Fisheries and Aquatic Sciences faculty workforce, Ms. Angelica Layugan.

With ten million pesos (10, 000,000.00) grant-in aide from the Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic, and Natural Resources Research and Development of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST-PCAARRD), the project aims to



map the genetic resources of M. rosenbergii (otherwise known as giant freshwater prawn) in the Philippines. Both wild-caught and hatchery-produced Macrobrachium samples would be used for genetic analyses to identify, develop, and produce appropriate and

fit M. rosenbergii strains for aquaculture production.

The project's output will aid policymakers in creating laws that will safeguard the genetic richness and prevent large-scale inbreeding and over-exploitation of the Macrobrachium stocks. It is

envisioned to improve the social well-being and increase the household income of fish farmers through the farming of giant freshwater prawns because of the availability of a sufficient number of seed stocks from hatchery production.

At the macro level, the project generally aims to

provide an innovative one enterprise solution for the LGU Aparri through the provision of an integrated web portal and a holistic database necessary to contain needed data, extract real-time information for decision making, and perform data analysis, from barangays to the delivery units of the local government units so that necessary services for the citizens are delivered in a fast, reliable, data-driven, and efficient means. The proposed ONEAPARRI: project aims to analyze, design, develop, implement, and train different

stakeholders of a relevant and responsive data-driven information system accessible in an online platform anytime, 24/7 and anywhere through mobile phones as well as SMS technology. While COTS or Commercial Off-The Shelf application is available, the software specifically is designed in the context of the immediate needs of the LGU.

The project is an initiative of the CSU team headed by Dr. Billy S. Javier in response to the noble request of the Local Government Unit of Aparri through the leadership of Mayor Bryan Dale Chan.

Approved and endorsed by the Local School Board and the members of the Sanguniang Bayan, the said project is a 2-and-a-half year undertaking with grant support of 1.6 million. The ONEAPARRI project is one with the LGU Aparri's vision of being one and integrated, true to its "nagkakaisang Pulso para sa pagbabago".
