DBM COMMENDS CSU IN AN AGENCY PERFORMANCE ASSESSMENT

After a review of CSU's performance covering the physical, financial, and income performance for the period January to December of Calendar Year 2021, the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) praised the university for its commendable performance for excelling in its mandate as a higher education institution.

Undersecretary Tina Rose Marie Canda, Officer-in-Charge for the Office of the Secretary of DBM, in her review summary, recognized CSU as the only SUC in the region included in the Top 10 Universities in the Philippines ranking No. 8 by the AD Scientific Index with Dr. Ma. Nilda Munoz, the University Senior Scientist who was ranked as the "Best Scientist in the University".

Furthermore, she cited that CSU has achieved or even surpassed all of its physical commitments for Fiscal Year



2021 and has utilized almost all of its available allotment for the year with a utilization rate of 96.69%.

Among those commended are the university's

accomplishments in surpassing the 50% targeted rate for first-time licensure examination takers by 20.09%, high percentage of employability of graduates, significant increase

in the percentage of students enrolled in priority programs, and recognition by the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines as a top performing SUC with the highest number of accredited programs.

"The government appreciates the efforts of your agency in delivering its commitments in terms of the performance indicators reflected in Volume II of the FY 2021 General Appropriation Act," Canda said.

President Alvarado extended her gratitude to the Planning Team led by Director Ramon Henry O. Kanapi and the Office of the Vice President for Administration and Finance under former VP Fr. Ranhilio C. Aquino in facilitating the required documents submitted to the DBM. Lastly, she thanked the CSU community for bringing great accomplishments to the university. -UIO

Cagayan State University Intellectual Property Management Program for Academic Institutions Commercializing Technologies (IMPACT) conducted a Technology Pitch Demo with the theme "Moving Forward Through Commercialization" last June 14, 2022 at the CSU Hotel Conference Room.

The event was an opportunity to gather the distinct technology creators and budding technopreneurs

from the different campuses to pitch their innovative, niche-relevant products for possible funding. University President Urdujah G. Alvarado delivered an inspirational message emphasizing the goal of CSU to be at the forefront of providing novelty to the community it serves. Hence, the timeliness of the program in inching a step further towards the said vision.

In order to warm up the participants, IMPACT

Project Leader Dr. Jose D. Guzman delivered a talk on "How to Move Forward with Your Technology?" where he detailed the process of the expectation that needs to be set in commercializing products. He highlights that there are no shortcuts in the technology incubation journey. It has to pass through a rigorous development process that may possibly pass through the "valley of death". Therefore, he added that there should be a primary consideration on education and customer discovery.

CSU IMPACT aims to serve the whole university on IP Management Training, IP Protection, IP Commercialization, and Academe-Industry Collaboration to further the research initiatives of CSU. -UIO



TUGUEGARAO TRICYCLE DRIVERS TEST OUT E-TRIKE

Cagayan State University-Carig Campus' newly developed e-trikes were tested by Tricycle Operators and Drivers Association (TODA) members in Cagayan last April 25, 2022 as part of the Information Education and Communication (IEC) Campaign on electronic tricycles (E-trikes).

The TODA members willingly tried and enjoyed the e-trike ride experience during the campaign at CSU Carig's Red Eagle Gymnasium. The

e-trike prototypes are being developed at the Philippines' first Electromobility Research and Development Center, which is also housed at CSU-Carig. This project is in partnership with the Department of Science and Technology (DOST)-Region 2, the DOST-Philippine Council for Industry, Energy, and Emerging Technology Research and Development (PCIEERD), the University of the Philippines-Diliman, and the Local Government Unit of Tuguegarao City. -UIO





CSU IS RECOGNIZED AS TOP ACCREDITED LEARNING INSTITUTION BY AACCUP

Cagayan State University received plaques of recognition from the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines (AACCUP) for its increasing number of accredited programs.

CSU was recognized as the Top 2 Performing SUC with the Highest Number of Level I Accredited Programs in 2021, with a total of 17 programs. It is also the Top 5 Performing SUC with the Highest Number of Level II Accredited Programs in 2021, with a total of 22 programs.

AACCUP also handed over the awards garnered by CSU for the year 2019, which rendered



CSU as the Top 1 Performing SUC with the Highest Number of Level II Accredited Programs in 2019 with a total of 35 programs. CSU also placed as the Top 3 Performing SUC with the Highest Number of Level I

Accredited Programs in 2019 with 13 programs. Moreover, CSU is also recognized as the Top 2 among the SUCs with the Highest Percentage of Accredited Programs with 99% of Total Accredited Programs

from 1992 to 2019.

President Alvarado assured her support for the university in future accreditation endeavors in the firm belief that quality assurance and excellence in service are important components of governance.

Targeting to submit some Level 3 accredited programs for Center of Development (COD), she urged Quality Assurance Director Hilaria Barsabal to immediately take action on the prospect of undergoing this higher level of accreditation. The 3 programs initially identified to be submitted for COD are BS Civil Engineering, AB Communication, and Bachelor of Secondary Education. -UIO

CSU-APARRI GRAD SCHOOL PROGRAMS UNDERGOES AACCUP ACCREDITATION

Cagayan State University-Aparri Campus submitted its graduate school programs for a 2nd Virtual Survey Visit to the Accrediting Agency for Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines (AACCUP) for quality assurance last May 2, 2022.

The virtual accreditation was done to put forward the Graduate School Curricular Program Offerings, which include Doctor of Philosophy in Education, Master of Arts in Education Major in Education Management and Major in English, and Master of Science in Teaching Major in Mathematics, which are all subject for Level

II accreditation, and Master of Science in Information Technology, which is subject to Level I accreditation.

University President Urdujah G. Alvarado delivered her inspirational message where she expressed her gratitude to the accreditors from AACCUP for their time in ensuring CSU delivers quality education. She also mentioned her appreciation to CSU-Aparri, under the tutelage of CEO Simeon R. Rabanal, Jr. and the Graduate School Dean Antonio C. AUN-QA APPROVES FOUR CSU ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

The ASEAN University Network-Quality Assurance System (AUN-QA), a Southeast Asian based organization designed to raise the quality of education in the region, has approved all of the four academic programs submitted for ASEAN Accreditation, which are Bachelor of Secondary Education, Bachelor of Science in Medical Laboratory Sciences, Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering, and

Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering.

The four programs were evaluated by assessors from Thailand, Indonesia, Vietnam, and Singapore through an online stringent assessment. Cagayan State University is the first university in northern Luzon that has its programs accredited by the ASEAN accrediting agency. It first became an associate member of AUN-QA last 2019 and has since made efforts to subject academic programs for

evaluation.

The recent accomplishments were made possible by CSU's AUN-QA Team headed by Ramon Henry O. Kanapi and in close collaboration with CSU-Andrews Campus CEO Theresa B. Dimalanta, CSU-Carig Campus CEO Art G. Ibañez, College of Teacher Education Dean Maridy Acebedo, College of Allied Health Sciences Dean Dorina Sabatin, and College of Engineering and Architecture Dean Audy Quebral and their team. -UIO

Six faculty members of Cagayan State University completed short-term training programs that sought to improve the competitiveness of Philippine higher education institutions in agriculture, fisheries, and natural resources. THRIPS AWAY: CSU JOINS IN RESEARCH DISSEMINATION ON SURVEILLANCE & DETECTION OF THRIPS ON AGRI PRODUCTS

Thrips or “kulisipsip” in Filipino, are a long standing enemy of farmers, mainly because of the damage they cause to agricultural products. The infestation of thrips on crops result in poor quality and low yield during the harvest season.


In action to educate farmers on preventing the spread of thrips from their farms, Cagayan State University partners with the Department of Agriculture-Bureau of Agricultural Research and National Crop

Protection Center, University of the Philippines Los Baños College of Agriculture and Food Science, and in collaboration with Benguet State University and De La Salle University, to bring to life the Online Research Results Dissemination and Learning Event, an online webinar that aims to relay the findings of the DA-BAR-funded research project entitled, “Surveillance and Detection of Microbe Utilizing Molecular Techniques and Associated Thrips Vector on Onion, Garlic, and Mango in Luzon”.

In her opening remarks, University President Urdujah G. Alvarado reiterated that it is important to cascade this knowledge to those who are on the ground, to those who are prone to experience it in their crops.

Dr. Cecilia P. Reyes, a retired professor from Cagayan State University and a renowned thrips specialist, is one of the speakers at the three-day learning event where each day is focused on a different crop that can be infested by the thrips vector. The first day was dedicated to mango,

the second to onion, and the third to garlic. The webinar also highlighted how to control thrips and how to biologically deter these insects. It also includes expert discussions on viruses and bacteria found on the highlighted agricultural products, as well as good agricultural practices that farmers can use.

The online event was done via Zoom, Facebook Live, and Youtube Live last June 21-23, 2022.  -UIO

CSU GONZAGA BROKE GROUND FOR A NEW TVET & BUSINESS OFFICE BUILDING

A promising future awaits CSU-Gonzaga as a new TVET and Business Office Building is anticipated in the campus. A Ground Breaking Activity was held on May 31, 2022 in anticipation of the new facility.

President Urdujah G. Alvarado and CSU-Gonzaga CEO Froilan Pacris Jr., joined by TESDA officials, led the groundbreaking ceremony of a 418.5 square meter building that will house instructional and laboratory facilities of TVET and a business office for the campus.

CSU Gonzaga has 13 Assessment Centers, 9 UTPRAS Registered Programs, and

1 Farmers' Field School and Diploma in Agricultural Technology catering to 560 enrollees for calendar year 2021. This year, 20 trainees are registered for Rice Machinery Operations NC II and 50 for Farmers Field School. More than 150 walk-in clients across different assessment qualifications this year are now NC II holders.

To cater to its latest TVET offering, Driving NC II, the campus recently acquired a new training vehicle, which was blessed on the same day.

E-MOBILITY R&D CENTER RECOGNIZED AS AN OUTSTANDING R&D CENTER



Cagayan State University -Carig Campus' NICER E-mobility R&D Center, was awarded as an Outstanding Research and Development Center during the 2022 DOST Science for Change Program Summit-North Luzon Cluster.

The Niche Centers in the Regions (NICER) E-mobility R&D Center located in CSU was recognized by the body for successfully converting conventional tricycles to electric tricycles, which is a greener and cleaner alternative for commuters.

Moreover, the E-mobility R&D Center has also been working closely with the LGU of Tuguegarao in order to eventually implement the e-trikes. LGU Tuguegarao promised to draft a local ordinance granting a 30,000 PHP subsidy to any interested tricycle drivers who switch to e-trikes. The production of an efficient and relatively low-cost e-trike will help the government to encourage people to shift to electric tricycles. The center will also produce cost-effective and energy-efficient e-trike parts, which will result in

fewer carbon emissions and lower fuel and maintenance costs. Aside from addressing air pollution, the center will create a new industry for e-trikes in the region and will generate more jobs and income.
