Senator Sherwin "Win" Gatchalian joined the CSU community in celebrating its Sapphire Anniversary at CSU Carig Red Eagle Gymnasium last June 7, 2023. CSU warmly received Senator Gatchalian together with CSU's key benefactors through a grand welcome dance composed of 5,000 students during the Anniversary Opening Program.

Congressman Joseph L. Lara, proponent of the establishment of CSU- Solana, delivered the welcome remarks, where he expressed how proud he is to be part of the CSU community and how supportive the academic administration had been in building the 9th campus from start to finish.

In her opening remarks, University President Urdujah G. Alvarado commemorated CSU from its humble beginnings into what it is today - a higher education institution decorated with national accolades, international quality seals, and excellent achievements in producing quality students.

The guest speaker was introduced by Fr. Ranhilio C. Aquino where he regarded Sen.

Gatchalian as an advocate of education. This is echoed in the senator's message, where he recalled his education abroad, which shaped his principle that "the blessing of education must be experienced by all." He recalled the lobbying process for the Free Tuition Law, which now covers CSU. "Kayo na po ang mapalad na nabigyan ng maganda at dekalidad na edukasyon. Huwag sayangin ang oportunidad. Mag-aral ng mabuti at umuwi na dala ang diploma", he advised the students.

In order to further support the cause of education in the university, the Kuya Win Scholarship Program was launched, which aims to provide financial assistance worth 15,000 php to 667 qualified and deserving CSU students for the next academic year.

The recognition of CSU's benefactors who supported the university in its mandate of implementing quality education, relevant research, and timely extension programs were also awarded during the event.

To cap off the program, the launching of the SARABO Exhibit, which features nichebased food products produced by CSU's campuses, was graced by the honorees.

A testimonial ceremony in honor of the new professionals was conducted to celebrate their



The Professional Regulation Commission (PRC) - Manila and the Professional Regulatory Board of Respiratory Therapy (PRBRT) presented last March 11, 2023 an Excellence Award to Cagayan State University - Andrews Campus for being the Top Performing School in the Respiratory Therapist Licensure Examination for the last 5 years. CSU was also recognized for having obtained the First Place, with 50 or more examinees

with at least 80% passing rate percentage. During the examination, CSU garnered an average of 100% passing rate percentage (136/136) among the schools/colleges/universities with exemplary passing rate performance in the February 2023 Respiratory Therapists Licensure Examination.

University President Urdujah G. Alvarado who received the award is honored to be the only University President who was invited to give a response, considering CSU's impressively outstanding board performance for the year 2023.

In her speech, she left the newly minted RTs a strong message to always remember as they step into a new and challenging world.

"Number 1 - be comfortable with being uncomfortable. New challenges will be inevitable in the future. Face it head-on with a growth mindset. The best way to get across problems that come along your way is to get through. Number 2 - do

ew CSUan educators join the roster! Cagayan State University's College of Teacher Education reaped its hard work with two national topnotchers in the outstanding list during the March 2023 Licensure Examination for Teachers. Ma. Erika Asuncion Abella, LPT from CSU-Andrews placed Top 2 with a percentage of 92% and Dazel Jean Samoy Alariao from CSU-Gonzaga clinched the Top 9 spot at 90.60%.

All CSU campuses have exceeded the national passing rate of 40.76% for the Elementary Education strand and 46.94% for the Secondary Education strand.

## CSU COLLEGE OF LAW TOPS WRITTEN PHASE OF INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION

SU College of Law's Nuremberg Moot Court Team bested 100 law schools all over the world to take the top spot on its written phase with a final score of 88.5. The results were released on May 22, 2023. The Team prepared both Prosecution and Defense Memorials on this year's moot case "The Prosecutor entitled Lieutenant Adelaide" which tackled issues in jurisdiction, admissibility, and criminal responsibility pursuant to articles 19, 17(d), 25(3)(b), and 25(3)(d) of the Rome Statute respectively.

The Team is composed of Marc Stephen Melad, Patrick Jan Dela Cruz, Vladimir Pati and Ma. Katrina Piano-Lim. The team was mentored by Dean Norman Clarence Lasam of the College of Law.

The Team was part of the 32 teams worldwide that competed in Nuremberg, Germany for the oral rounds last July 19-22, 2023 where they emerged as quarterfinalist after defeating Team Armenia.

The Nuremberg Moot Court is an international competition held in English in Nuremberg, Germany. Teams from all over the world are invited to argue a fictitious case before the "International Criminal Court". A moot court is a simulated court proceeding which invites law students

to compete and present written and oral arguments for both the prosecution and the defense.

Students are given the unique opportunity to develop their skills and plead at the historic Courtroom 600 of the Nuremberg Palace of Justice, where the Nuremberg trials against the major Nazi war criminals took place. UIO

### **CSU BIDS FAREWELL TO THE BATCH OF 2023**

agayan State University had officially bid farewell to 6,225 graduates for the 45th Academic Convocation for the Conferment of Degrees and Titles. The series of graduation rites occurred from July 10 to 21, 2023 and were divided into 14 batches all of which transpired in CSU's respective campuses.

The Carig Campus has the highest number of graduates with a total of 2,335 which is followed by Andrews with 1,266. The Aparri Campus produced 938 new professionals, Sanchez

Mira Campus registered 599 new degree holders, Piat Campus conferred 397 new titles, Gonzaga Campus congratulated 279 graduates, Lal-lo Campus brought forward 243 graduates, and Lasam Campus had the least number of graduates at 168.

The graduates and their proud parents marched with the university officials, President Urdujah G. Alvarado, VP for Academics - Dr. Mariden V. Cauilan, VP for Research Development and Extension

agayan State University assured its full support to the United States Agency for International Development(USAID)'s partnership programs resilience energy and sustainability in the provinces Cagayan and Isabela by hosting the ceremonial launching held at CSU Lal-lo Campus last June 16, 2023.

The USAID, through its Assistant Administrator Michael Schiffer, granted a total of P65.4 million for

partnership programs unveiled during the ceremony which include the mobile solar photovoltaic (Solar PV) generator intended to help Local Government Units (LGUs) in strengthening their capabilities during emergencies; their capacity building for energy USAĬĎ resilience through Energy Secure Philippines; and the partnership granting the promotion of the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Act of 2019.

### **CSU IS NOW A SCHOLARSHIP-DELIVERING** INSTITUTION OF DOST-SEI



Department of Science and Technology - Science Education Institute (DOST - SEI) officially announced last August 3, 2023, the approval of Cagayan State University (CSU) as a delivering institution of the project dubbed "Science and Technology Regional Alliance of Universities for National Development (STRAND) for the Niche Centers in the Regions for R&D (NICER)" or Project STRAND-N effective for the First Semester of AY 2023 – 2024. CSU is

considered a STRAND N2 scholarshipdelivering institution for the identified graduate degree programs - Ph.D. in Education major in Science Education, MS in Teaching major in Mathematics, MS in Teaching major in Chemistry, MS in Teaching major in Biology, MS in Teaching major in Physics and MS Technology Information (Aparri Campus).

Five scholarship slots will be available for each academic program identified and will be endorsed to the institute no later than August 31, 2023. The graduate scholars will receive the following scholarship

privileges: (Masteral) monthly stipend of P22,000, up to P60,000 thesis grant, around P225,000 student research support fund, among others; (Doctoral) -P33,000 monthly stipend, P100,000 for dissertation, P475,000 student research support fund, etc.

The competition aimed to create innovative and original food products responsive to the needs of the future. It challenged the participating teams to develop and innovate food solutions using their niche products: cacao, coffee,

bamboo, rice, milk, coconut, seaweed, and crab as their main ingredients.

The Fillet of GG Confit of Andrews Campus bagged the first prize, winning Php 10,000, and the Salted Caramel Streusel Bar, also from Andrews garnered the 2nd prize, winning Php 5,000. The third spot was presented to CSU Gonzaga's Bamboo Shoot Pasta, which won Php 3,000. The Kanyogan Garden Crisps of Sanchez Mira and the Rice

Chips enhanced with Seaweeds of Carig were awarded 4th and 5th placers, respectively.

The winners were determined by a Board of judges, which included the Assistant Secretary of DOST, Dr. Diana Ignacio; the former Director of DOST-TAPI, Dr. Edgar I. Garcia; and the DOST Regional Director for Region XI, Dr. Anthony C. Sales, who served as the Chairman of the team. After the awarding of winners, the judges all gave very

positive feedback, emphasizing that the food products were all innovative and had great potential. Impressed by the comments from the judges, the President pledged to give funding to all submitted food innovations through their campus Research, Development and Extension units. ## CSU-APARRI GETS A 9.5M TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER FUND FROM DOST-PCAARRD

of Department Science and Technology Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic and Natural Resources Research and Development (DOST PCAARRD) has now downloaded a funding assistance of P9.5M to Cagayan State University (CSU) - Aparri Campus for the technology teansfer project called "Adoption of Improved Hatchery - Nursery Culture System for Commercial Production of Mangrove Crab Seedstock in Buguey, Cagayan" with Dr. Quirino Pascua, Dean of the College of Fisheries, as the project leader.

The said project was defended to the governing board of DOST by President Urdujah Alvarado and representatives from LGU Buguey as they expressed their commitment and support to sustain the operation of the project once it

is turned over to them by CSU in 2025. The project, which will run for two years, aims to launch the technology on a commercial-scale mangrove crab hatchery-nursery system to maintain a reliable supply of mangrove crab seedstocks in Buguey, Cagayan.

The proposed hatchery, according to Dr. Pascua, is "expected to supply 2.22% of the total demand for crablets in the province per year, eventually contributing an estimated increase in volume of mangrove crab production of 0.002% (regional) and 66.94% (municipal) equivalent to 60MT valued at PhP 27 million per year."

Through the project, CSU Aparri assures that mangrove crab hatchery-nursery-grower operators in Buguey will not depend anymore on seedstocks from the wild. -UIO

### **AD SCIENTIFIC INDEX RANKS CSU AS TOP 8 IN PH**

agayan State University is Top 8 public university in the AD Scientific Index and World Scientist and University Rankings 2023. The Alper-Doger (AD) Index is a ranking and analysis system based on the scientific performance and the added value of the scientific productivity of individual scientists. It also provides rankings of institutions based on the scientific characteristics of affiliated scientists.

CSU was identified in the Philippines Top 5000 Scientists AD Scientific Index 2023 which was officially released last January 2023, with Dr. Maria Nilda Munoz as the Country's Top 10 scientist in the Philippines and CSU's Top 1 Researcher in the AD Index of 2023. The research productivity of researchers was measured based on the total and the last five-year productivity coefficients of scientists based on the h index and i10 index scores and citations in Google Scholar. This analysis also helps reveal the medium and longterm results of several policies implemented by institutions, including those of the academic staff employment and retention policies, wage policies, academic incentives, and scientific working environments.

## CSU IS NOW A REGISTERED BOOK PUBLISHER FOR PRINT AND DIGITAL PUBLICATIONS



SU received a Book Publisher status certification from the National Book Development Board (NBDB) in accordance with the Book Publishing Industry Act or RA 8047.

This certification allows the university a stronger science communication system and ownership of knowledge produced along its IREP (Instruction, Research, Extension and Production) mandates.

Charisse Aquino-Tugade, the Executive Director of NBDB, signed the certificate, which remains valid until the 30th of April 2024. As a registered publisher, CSU is authorized to publish various types of books, textbooks, scientific, cultural, medical, architectural, and professional magazines, and book catalogs. These publications can be written by various stakeholders, including students, faculty, and staff of CSU, as well as external stakeholders.

With this registration, CSU is now recognized and added to the NBDB's Online Registry as a registered publisher. The registration also grants CSU access to the online application of International Book Standard Number (ISBN) and

International Serial Standard Number (ISSN) of the National Library of the Philippines. These privileges help enhance CSU's capabilities as a publisher and contribute to developing the Philippine book publishing industry. It will strengthen its ownership of the knowledge produced and intellectual properties.

President Alvarado commended the Office of the Knowledge Technology Management, under the directorship of Dr. Gilbert Magulod for facilitating the issuance of this certificate of registration.





Ismail signed the document, with Faculty of Chemical and Energy Engineering Dean Rahmat bin Mohsin as a witness.
