

agayan State University (CSU) has once again shown its unwavering dedication to excellence and quality management. Not only has the university maintained its ISO-certified status, but it has also achieved a remarkable milestone with five additional campuses being recommended for ISO 9001:2015 certification. This triumph comes after a thorough, weeklong surveillance audit conducted by Certification International

Philippines (CIP) from October 14 to 18, 2024.

Opening Meeting: Commitment to Excellence

The audit kicked off on October 14, 2024, with an opening meeting at the CSU Andrews Claude Convention Center. CSU's Officer-in-Charge President, Dr. Arthur G. Ibañez, along with other university officials, warmly welcomed the CIP audit team. The team was led by Ms. Lyn

Cayetano and supported by auditors Mr. Edgardo Eleria, Mr. Justo Batoon, and Ms. Liza

In his opening remarks, Dr. Ibañez stressed the significance of the audit in CSU's ongoing quest for continuous improvement and excellence. He also paid tribute to former CSU President, Dr. Urdujah G. Alvarado, for securing the university's initial ISO certification in 2022, and praised the dedication of the university's ISO process

owners, officials, and staff.

The CIP audit team undertook a detailed evaluation of CSU's management system. They examined key areas such as the design, development, and delivery of tertiary education and various frontline services. The audit spanned multiple campuses, including Andrews, Aparri, Carig, Sanchez Mira, Gonzaga, Lal-lo, Lasam, Piat, and Solana, ensuring a thorough assessment of the university's operations.

audit concluded on October 18, 2024, with a closing meeting where lead auditor, Ms. Lyn Cayetano, shared the findings. She lauded CSU for its substantial improvements, especially addressing previous non-conformities, and highlighted the effectiveness its management system the maintaining high

standards required for ISO certification.

As a result of the successful audit, CSU not only retained its ISO-certified status but also received recommendations for ISO 9001:2015 certification for five additional campuses—Gonzaga, Lal-lo, Lasam, Piat, and Solana.

Expressing his gratitude to the CIP auditors, Dr. Ibañez reaffirmed CSU's dedication to continuous improvement. "We assure you of our ongoing compliance and commitment

to enhancing our management system. This achievement reflects our collective efforts to uphold the highest standards of quality education and service delivery," he stated.

A Legacy of Quality Assurance

CSU first received its ISO 9001:2015 certification on December 2, 2022, covering the Andrews, Aparri, Carig, and Sanchez Mira campuses. This certification, valid until December 1, 2025, marked a

significant milestone in the university's pursuit of quality management.

With the successful completion of this second surveillance audit and the recommendation for additional campuses, CSU continues to reinforce its position as a leader in quality education, ensuring that its systems and processes meet international standards.



CSU AND ISU FORGE PARTNERSHIP FOR RESEARCH COLLABORATION

agayan State University (CSU), under the leadership of OIC President Arthur G. Ibañez, and Isabela State University (ISU), headed by President Ricmar P. Aquino, have officially entered into a partnership for research collaboration.

CSU - Andrews Campus, through the College of Teacher Education (CTE), initiated the first research collaboration. Key CSU-developed tools, such as the Research Capability Test (RCT), Research Capability Rubric (RCR), and Research Self-Efficacy Scale (RSES), will be leveraged to assess

and elevate the research competencies of teacher educators in Region 02.

Meanwhile, Cagayan State University-Aparri Campus has forged a separate MOU to advance the discipline of fisheries, covering areas such as aquaculture, capture fisheries, aquatic resources and ecology, and postharvest fisheries.

The agreement, formalized through a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) and Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), was signed on December 12, 2024, at the CSU Andrews Conference Hall.





CSU LAUNCHES INTERNATIONAL CONVOCATION FRAMEWORKS IN PARTNERSHIP WITH GLOBAL INSTITUTIONS, ADVANCING ATHENA INTERNATIONALIZATION ROADMAP









State agayan University (CSU), through the Office of the Vice President Internationalization, Partnership, and Resource Mobilization, marked a historic milestone with the launch of two pioneering frameworks for its International Convocation Series in December 2024. These initiatives, aligned with CSU's Athena Internationalization Roadmap and the CHED IZN Framework, emphasize the university's unwavering commitment to global collaboration and academic excellence.

Green Framework: Life Sciences, Agriculture, Fisheries, and Food

The inaugural convocation, known as the Green Framework or the International Convocation on Life Sciences, Agriculture, Fisheries, and Food (ICLSAFF), was launched in partnership with Warmadewa University of Indonesia on December 9, 2024. This initiative invited participation from esteemed institutions in Vietnam, Taiwan, and India, fostering a collaborative mission to address pressing challenges in these critical fields.

In his opening address, OIC University President Dr. Arthur G. Ibañez emphasized the importance of collective

action: "As a unified global community, let us take decisive action to address the pressing challenges faced in the fields of life sciences, agriculture, fisheries, and related disciplines."

The Green Framework was spearheaded by Vice President for Internationalization, Ana Marie Cauilan, Dr. and Internationalization Director, Kristinne A. Lara, with significant contributions from Fisheries Dean Dr. Quirino Pascua, Agriculture Dean Dr. Andrea Dawan, and Warmadewa's Dr. Luh Suriati. A total of 189 participants, including faculty, students, and researchers, engaged in plenary sessions, panel discussions, and joint research projects. The six-month projects. The six-month program will culminate in the projects. Nexus Summit in July 2025, where research outputs and collaborative projects will be showcased.

Red Framework: Applied Science and Technology

Following the success of the Green Framework, CSU launched the Red Framework the International or Convocation on Applied Science and Technology (ICAST) on December 12, 2024. This initiative was held in collaboration with Yuvakshetra Institute of Management Studies in India and Singsoft

Pte. Ltd. of Singapore.

Focused on collaborative creating platform industry academia, practitioners, community leaders, and students, ICAST aims to address the rapid advancements in technology and its implications for sustainable economic growth and social development.

In his message, Dr. Ibañez highlighted the importance of leveraging science and technology responsibly:
"With the demands of the contemporary world, our dedication to S&T innovation and research must be vunwavering as we work to discover long-term solutions that benefit all humankind. Let us dedicate ourselves to the responsible use of science and technology, making sure that our efforts reflect the principles of sustainability and equity." This

framework organized by Dr. Ana Marie Cauilan and implemented by Internationalization Director Kristinne A. Lara, with contributions from College of Engineering and Architecture Dean Dr. JM Casibang, College of Information and Computing Sciences Dean Dr. Gener Siddayao, and College Technology of Industrial Dean Bryan T. Lacambra. The convocation featured plenary sessions, panel discussions, case studies, and mentorship

programs designed to equip participants with the skills and knowledge necessary to thrive in applied science and technology fields.


Global Engagement in Action

TWO CSU DELEGATES SECURE PROJECT GRANTS AT ASIAN UNDERGRADUATE SYMPOSIUM

students from wo Cagayan State (CSU) University have been awarded prestigious Asian Symposium Undergraduate (AUS) 2024 Seed Grant for their outstanding project proposals presented at the National University of Singapore (NUS).

The teams of Ms. Trixie Joy

Gano, a BS Biology student, and Mr. Jaren Quegan, a BS Computer Science student, both from Cagayan State University - Carig Campus, were among the eight winning groups selected from universities across Asia. Their projects—"Carbon Sustain for Good (CS4G)," an integrated system for tracking carbon

emissions in Malaysia, and "FINable: A Financial Literacy Card Game," which aims to bridge financial education gaps for low-income youth—each received a seed grant of P220,000 for implementation.

The symposium, hosted by NUS, gathered over 1,200 students from 11 Asian countries. It provided a platform for cultural exchange, networking, and skill development. Participants worked closely with experts in their fields, honed their project proposal writing skills, and collaborated to tackle specific social and environmental challenges through innovative solutions.





agayan State University (CSU), led by OIC President Dr. Arthur G. Ibañez, signed a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Electric Vehicles Association of the Philippines (EVAP) on October 26, 2024, at the 12th Philippine Electric Vehicle Summit to boost collaboration in electronic vehicle education, research, and innovation.

Through this partnership, CSU will incorporate EV-focused curriculum enhancements, research initiatives, and technology development, with support from EVAP's expertise and

resources. EVAP will, in turn, provide CSU students and faculty opportunities to participate in EV-related projects, competitions, and events to promote sustainable mobility solutions, among others.

In addition, a team of five engineering and architecture students from Cagayan State University - Carig Campus ranked second in the Electric Tricycle Design Contest (Member Category), with their innovative "CSU Eagle Trike," developed at CSU's Electromobility Research and Development Center.

The team, consisting

of Ria Linda K. Nedic (Civil Engineering), Sherwin E. Casay (Architecture), Jhonnfrael Eronz P. Mijares (Electrical Engineering), Vincent Renzo Quilon (Electronics and Communications Engineering), and Rosshean Ipalari (Computer Engineering), outshined 23 participants from across the


CSÚ Eagle Trike is designed to embody both sustainability and university pride, featuring an eagle-inspired look with a head-shaped front, wing-like side panels, and a color scheme of red, white, bronze, gold, and black.

Beyond its design, the e-trike offers an eco-friendly commuting option with zero emissions and significantly reduced operational costs compared to gasoline-powered vehicles. It can carry six passengers, reach a speed of 45 km/h, and travel up to 50 km on a single charge. The durable battery recharges in 2-3 hours and supports battery swapping, allowing for continuous operation.

Additionally, EVAP awarded CSU a certificate of membership, recognizing the university as an academic member in good standing.







agayan State university conducted its 44th In-House University Review at the Claude Andrews convention center on October 22, 2024, attended by professors from the campuses. with the theme "Innovating Sustainable Futures Through Impactful Research Development and Extension to Accelerate SDG Solutions.", This in-house review aims to explore various research proposals with innovative approaches focused on addressing Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

OIC University President, Arthur G. Ibañez, welcomed the participants and highlighted the importance of RDE in the in-house review, "The focus of every institution, not only in the Philippines, but in the world, is now on Sustainable Goals Development. 

MODERN IVATAN HOUSE TO RISE IN BATANES, BLENDING HERITAGE WITH RESILIENCE



modern version of the traditional Ivatan house is set to be completed early next year, following the groundbreaking of a pilot project on October 23, 2024, at Sitio Mutchong, Brgy. Kayvaluganan in Uyugan, Batanes.

Funded by the Department of Science and Technology (DOST), the project titled "Assessment, Development, and Preservation for Typhoon and Earthquake-Resilient Ivatan Houses" aims to protect the unique Ivatan architectural heritage from future natural disasters while preserving its cultural value. As OIC President Arthur G. Ibañez noted in a recent seminar at Soka University in Japan, "By integrating modern engineering into the foundation, stone walls, and roof frames, we can enhance these houses' resilience without losing their historical essence."

The new C-OI design features 360mm thick masonry walls and double wall cladding, maintaining the Ivatan style while incorporating modern reinforcements. The structure will also serve as a monitoring station for typhoon and earthquake resilience, offering valuable data for future projects.

The groundbreaking ceremony was attended by Uyugan Mayor Jonathan Enrique Nanud, Architect Jeferson Abiva of the Ivatan Houses Project, and Batanes State College President Djovi Durante, with blessings from Reverend Father Andres Algerico P. Gonzales.

Support for the project also comes from Cagayan State University, Batanes State College, and local government and community partners, all dedicated to preserving and strengthening Ivatan heritage in the face of an unpredictable climate.

According to PhilHealth, CSU students who have been assessed as financially incapable will be enrolled as indirect contributors, exempt from paying monthly contributions until they graduate. The PhilHealth membership registration will also be expanded to include students from other CSU campuses.

As part of this initiative, the students will be enrolled in PhilHealth's Konsultasyong Sulit Tama (Konsulta) Program after their membership registration, providing them

with essential outpatient benefits such as consultations, screenings, diagnostic tests, and selected medications.

The Konsulta Program, mandated under the Universal Health Care (UHC) Law, ensures that all Filipinos have access to quality and affordable healthcare services while protecting them from financial risks associated with medical treatments.

Meanwhile, a Konsulta Caravan is being held on October 17, 2024, at the CSU Hotel, in collaboration with the Cagayan Valley Medical Center (CVMC) and PhilHealth. The event provides free consultations, health risk screenings, and assessments for the university's teaching and non-teaching personnel, with 10 medical doctors on site

the university's performance in 2024, assess the progress of various initiatives, discuss challenges, align objectives and establish key strategic goals for 2025.




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
